FROM THE COLLECTIONS OF JORDAN D. SCHNITZER
AND HIS FAMILY FOUNDATION

May 30 through August 16, 2009

An internationally acclaimed printmaker and sculptor, Montana-based artist John Buck is the subject of this 40-year career overview. Buck was born in Ames, Iowa, in 1946 and the Cedar Rapids Museum of Art will be the only Iowa venue for this nationally touring exhibition. Featuring more than 60 works, the exhibition includes large-scale prints, sculpture, and wooden constructions (shadow boxes), as well as examples of the carved blocks for the prints, several prints in different states prior to completion, and wood carving and printmaking tools.
